



**CLOSING DOWN
OR RESTING A
WORM FARM
FOR THE
HOLIDAY PERIOD**



1. Take the lid and blanket off the worm farm.



**2. Aerate the soil
with a tool
thoroughly.**



3. Lucerne Chaff is a nitrogen rich low maintenance feed for your worms while you are away.



4. Using a 10 litre bucket, fill with Lucerne Chaff until it is nearly full.

This will be enough for one worm farm.



5. Fill the 10 litre bucket containing Lucerne Chaff with water.

Once full leave the Lucerne Chaff to absorb the water for about 15 mins.



6. Add handfuls of the wetted Lucerne Chaff into the top layer (feeding tray) of your worm farm.



7. Create a layer that is about a hand's width in height in the top tray (feeding tray) of your worm farm.



8. Water the worm farm until water is running out of the bottom worm juice tray.

Ensure the tap is left open while you are away.



9. Put the blanket and lid back on and say goodbye for the holidays!



10. On your return, take off the lid and blanket and give the worms a good water and mix.

You should have some superb worm castings for your gardens.
